



Bridge Lighting and Other Signals


In general, red lights (A) are used to mark piers and supports, and green lights (B) mark the centerline of the navigable channel through a fixed bridge. If there is more than one channel, the preferred route is marked by three white lights (C) placed vertically. Red lights (D) are also used on some lift bridges to indicate the lift is closed, and green lights (E) to indicate that the lift is open to vessel traffic. Double-opening swing bridges are lighted with three lanterns on top of the span so that when viewed from an approaching vessel the swing span when closed will display three red lights (F), and when open for navigation will display two green lights (G).


Double Leaf (Lift) Bascule Bridge




Vertical Lift Span Bridge (Open)
